

Edgewood Trash Service Fact Sheet

Collection

Carroll County Waste Services will begin providing weekly trash and recycling collection on THURSDAY, February 7, 2008. We are locally owned and operated, family business that is looking forward to providing you with great service!

- There isn't a limit on the amount of trash, but only residential trash will be collected. We cannot take construction or demolition debris, chemicals or hazardous materials or tires.
- We will not enter your neighborhood before 7:00 a.m. We will make every effort to operate on a consistent schedule.
- Bulk items will be collected twice a year on dates arranged with the association.
- Trash cans: You may use your own cans or rent a wheeled, lidded can from us. The annual rental is \$21 and arrangements for this optional service can be made by calling Carol, 410-795-2595.

Recycling

Recycling is also collected on Thursday, but by a different truck that may run on a different schedule than the trash truck. See page 2 of this document for recycling information.

Holidays

We are closed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Yard Waste

Carroll County landfill does not allow us to mix yard waste (grass, leaves, trimmings) with trash. As part of the service agreement, we will be collecting yard waste separately and details of these arrangements will be announced in the Spring.

What To Recycle:

- Glass jars and bottles
 - All food and beverage jars and bottles of all colors
- Rigid plastic bottles and jugs
 - Narrow neck plastic (numbers 1-7)
- Newspaper/Inserts
- Aluminum & Tin
 - All food & beverage containers, foil and disposable aluminum pans
- Magazines
- Telephone Directories
- Junk Mail/Envelopes
- Catalogues
- Cardboard (flattened and in proper dimensions)
- Chipboard without inserts
- Office and school paper

What Not To Recycle:

- Styrofoam
- Window glass
- Drinking glasses
- Dishes and ceramics
- Light bulbs
- Mirrors
- Wide neck plastic containers
- Plastic toys
- Plastic food containers
- Plastic film, wrap or bags
- Plastic plates and cutlery
- Plant pots
- Fencing or siding
- Hangers or wire
- Wax coated cardboard
- Grease soaked paper
- Carbon paper
- Blue prints
- Scrap metal
- Pots and pans

Cardboard should be flattened and be no larger than 2' x 2'

Carroll County now has “single stream” recycling. You no longer need to separate recycled items. You are free to use one container for glass, plastic, metal and paper!
